The Summer School is part of the study program of the International Graduate College 'Conflict and Cooperation between Social Groups', an interdisciplinary, multi-site integrative graduate education and research traineeship program.

The summer school will consist of three parallel workshops. After a general introduction of the workshop topic by the teachers, participants will develop research ideas in small groups. These ideas will be discussed with in the workshop and presented to the plenum on the final day. In addition there will be opportunities for individual consultation and advising.

Accommodation and full board will be covered by the IGC. You are asked to find financial support for your travel by yourself.

The Summer School will take place at the Vierseithof, a historic Prussian Manor House in the city of Luckenwalde some 60 kilometres south of Berlin.

The landscape is stamped by a colorful mixture of beautiful forests, hidden farming villages with interesting churches, fields and untouched nature reserves. In the 12th century, Flemish settlers named this pine tree region strongly influenced by the ice age Fläming.

Applications including a short Curriculum Vitae, a statement describing the own research interests (one page, e.g., the PhD-project) and your preference concerning the three workshops (1=highest preference; 3=lowest preference) should be directed to the
